Massimo Bucarelli is Associate Professor of History of International Relations at the Department of Methods and Models for Economics, Territory and Finance, at “Sapienza” University of Rome, where he teaches History of European Integration and History of International Relations.

He received his PhD in History of International Relations from “Sapienza” University of Rome. He served as research fellow and associate professor at the University of Bari “Aldo Moro” and the University of Salento in Lecce, and as adjunct professor at the University of Parma and the University of Rome LUMSA.

Professor Bucarelli is member of the scientific committees and editorial boards of the following scholarly journals: «Nuova Rivista Storica», «Istorijski Zapisi» (University of Montenegro), and «Rivista Italiana di Storia Internazionale». He is member of the Scientific Committee for the Publication of Italian Diplomatic Documents, at the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation. He is also member of the Scientific Board of the Doctoral Programme in Political Studies at “Sapienza” University of Rome.

His main research interests focus on Italian foreign policy in the 20th Century, with particular attention to Italy’s political and economic strategies towards the Mediterranean area and Southeast Europe, Italy’s oil policy in the Middle East, and Italy’s participation in the European Common Foreign and Security Policy.

He is author and editor of monographs and books on Italian-Libyan relations, on Italian-Yugoslav relations, and on ENI (Ente Nazionale Idrocarburi)’s international action, including: 1) *Andreotti e Gorbačëv.
